She has appeared as soloist with the Kentucky Symphony Orchestra, Seven Hills Sinfonietta, and Meridian Symphony. A 2017 Yamaha Young Performing Artist and CCM Kemp Horn Scholar of her class, she also has won numerous competitions, including the Three Arts Neff Scholarship, CCM Undergraduate Instrumentalist competition, YoungArts Merit award, and Andrew Howell Memorial competition.

A native of Boise, Idaho, Ms Hembree's interest in music began at age 5, when she started playing violin. She discovered the horn at age 10.

Outside of music, she enjoys skiing, hiking, and traveling.

He evolved from playing the euphonium in grade school into a trombone player by the time he was in high school. He also plays the bass trumpet - the first instrument he played at Carnegie Hall.
