

Presenting for your enjoyment after lunch: Aria412 - A Salute to Gershwin

Symphony East welcomes back **Aria412** - the ensemble formed by Desirée Soteres and Kelly Fiona Lynch to bring delightfully eclectic programs of opera, musical theatre, jazz, and popular music to audiences in diverse public settings. From the beginning, there has been a commitment not only to provide performing opportunities for seasoned singers in the greater Pittsburgh area, but also for younger singers beginning their careers. The **Aria412** ensemble for our program is:

Robert Frankenberry enjoys a multi-faceted relationship with music as a singer, pianist, conductor, orchestrator, director, and even occasionally as a composer. On stage, he has performed a wide range of roles including Mozart (*Amadeus*), John Adams (1776), Bacchus (*Ariadne auf Naxos*). As a pianist, he regularly performs works by living composers. He has served on the coaching/accompanying staff at Seton Hill, Duquesne, CMU, and Point Park; the voice faculty at Mercyhurst and Point Park; and the Theatre Arts faculty at the University of Pittsburgh. He served as visiting Music Director for the opera program at the University of North Texas, and was significantly involved with Pittsburgh Festival Opera from 2000 – 2021 in various capacities.

Caryn Greco is a Norwegian-American Soprano who has sung on the operatic and concert stages of the United States and Canada. Her signature roles include Lauretta (Gianni Schicchi), Elsie Maynard (Yeoman of the Guard), and the title role of *Rusalka*. Caryn has an active recital schedule touring the works of Scandinavian composers. She is the Assistant Professor of Voice at Wake Forest University in NC.

Betsy Lawrence's favorite credits are performing with NYC Opera, Andrew Lloyd Weber's *Cats*, Pittsburgh CLO, Pittsburgh Musical Theater, PBS Television My Music Series, and Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. Betsy is a faculty member at CMU and the director of the Jazz Choir.

Katie Manukyan is a Pittsburgh-based soprano who sings with numerous local musical organizations such as Aria412, Pittsburgh Opera, and Pittsburgh Festival Opera, among others. She was named a "Major Artist" at the 2016 Pittsburgh Concert Society competition and is a specialist in Slavic vocal repertoire.

Vinay Thomas is a singer who is passionate about helping others find their voice through transformative artistic experiences. A native of Dallas, TX, Vinay is a classically trained singer who believes that all healthy singing has the same foundational techniques. Currently, he serves at the Pittsburgh Cultural Trust as the Manager of Volunteer Services and Front of House Guest Experience.

▶ ▶ PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGES

The Executive Board has proposed a 2024 revision to the Symphony East By-Laws. The primary change is to reduce the categories of members to two: General Membership and Couples Membership. The annual dues for General Members is set at \$35 and at \$65 for Couples. Other changes reflect the de facto current practice to identify nominees for the elected offices and the holding of four general membership meetings each year. Language improvements are also implemented.

Current dues-paying members for the 2023-2024 Symphony East season received a more detailed synopsis of the proposed changes under separate cover. The changes approved by the Executive Board were read at the March 2024 meeting and will be offered for member approval at the May 2024 meeting.

>>> President's message:

We had a very successful fundraiser last month. We raised nearly \$4,400 for the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. That amount will be added to that of the Pittsburgh Symphony Association. (We are an affiliate of the PSA.) Many thanks to the fundraising committee for an outstanding production.

As has been advertised previously, the May meeting is for installation of officers and to vote on some changes to the by laws. During the pandemic, it became apparent that we needed more flexibility in planning and in meeting dates. It also became apparent that we would have to raise membership fees and luncheon charges. We cannot operate in the red. As an example, our March meeting showed a loss of over \$75. The board cannot allow this deficit spending to continue. We regret the necessity of raising prices but they reflect the increased costs of providing high quality luncheons and entertainment.

The Board also considered the proposal that we require a person to become a member after two visits as a guest. We felt this would not agree with our stated purpose to bring good music to the community by reaching as many people as we can. Therefore, we will not endorse this proposal.

This will be the last meeting until September. Have a good summer and be ready to support the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra again in the Fall. — Pat Frick

As of March 30, 2024, the ending balance was 9,520.84 of which 1,700 was allocated to the Entertainment budget. The income from the *April in Paris* fundraiser was 6,993.00 and the expense (luncheon and printing/ postage expenses) was 2,605.97 = 4,387.03 profit. The Entertainment budget paid 600.00 to the performers. For the season to date, the portion of members' dues to be given to PSA is 419.00.
