# Performance: Musical selections by Bill Purse - guitarist/vocalist





Professor **Bill Purse** chaired the Music Technology program (now entitled Contemporary Music Media and Jazz) at Duquesne University from 1992 where he was instrumental in the development of two new Master's Degree majors: Music Technology and Sound Recording Technology. He also served as Area Chair of Jazz Guitar and Electric Bass.

He received his Bachelor of Music and Master of Music at Duquesne, as well as an EduCom (Education Communication) grant for study with Dr. Carol Lennox at Mills College for multimedia development in 1990. He has studied composition with Dr. Joseph Wilcox Jenkins at Duquesne's School of Music; received both the University's 1996 President's award for excellence in scholarship and a 2001 Lifetime Achievement Award for guitar pedagogy and performance including a citation for lifetime educational achievement from the Pennsylvania Senate.

His expertise in Music Technology, Electronic Performance, and Electronic Composition make him a frequent lecturer, clinician, and author at a wide array of national conferences, online webinars, and at educational institutions in the US and Canada. He provides national outreach to music educators throughout the US. The Teaching Guitar Workshops (TGW) was created to revitalize the guitar in education, and since 1995, over 4,000 school music teachers across the United States and Canada have enjoyed TGW.

Professor Purse pioneered the use of interactive digital media for his classroom and private/online teaching at Duquesne. He has specialized in developing accelerated courses for mastering the guitar. He is a composer for film and contemporary works for symphony orchestra, symphonic wind band, large jazz ensemble, solo and chamber instrumental works. He is also an arranger and producer for radio soundtracks, audio books and television, having produced and released several albums of original music. He has creatively written music from both the acoustic and electronic perspective, and gained wide recognition for his compositions that are musical interpretations of his Western Pennsylvania home. He will be composing and recording a new solo CD "In the Loop", developing more audio book projects, and enjoying playing guitar, teaching private online music technology and guitar lessons, and playing chess along with enjoying a well-deserved retirement.

(Incidentally, Mr. Purse performed the *Dr. Who Concerto for Theremin* with the Washington, Pa Symphony.)
