The Bel Suono Chamber Ensemble is a chamber group comprised of professional musicians located in the Pittsburgh area who strive for high quality performances of a diverse range of music from the chamber music repertoire.

Nolan Petote is a freelance musician and teacher based in Pittsburgh. He has performed numerous times with the orchestras of Charleston (SC), Albany (NY), South Florida, Wheeling, Westmoreland, and Johnstown. He maintains a large private clarinet and saxophone studio at two locations in the Pittsburgh area and through teaching online lessons. He is also the woodwind coordinator of the Pittsburgh Youth Concert Orchestra and the administrator of the Newlonsburg Music Academy. Mr. Petote holds a Masters in Music Performance and Advanced Music Studies Degrees from Carnegie Mellon University and a Bachelors of Music Performance Degree from Duquesne University (2012 Magna Cum Laude graduate). He played clarinet in the Pittsburgh Youth Symphony Orchestra from 2007 to 2010.

Julia Simeone has been surrounded by music ever since she was born and violin became an instant passion for her since she was three years old. She graduated from Seton Hill University with a degree in Psychology and from Slippery Rock University with a degree in Violin Performance studying violin with Dr. Warren Davidson and cello with Dr. Paige Riggs. She actively performs around Pittsburgh as a member of the Westmoreland Symphony Orchestra, concertmaster of the Pittsburgh Civic Orchestra, a member of PYCO School of Music Faculty, and frequently playing in musicals for various productions. As a very enthusiastic and patient Suzuki-Certified violin teacher, she believes that learning music not only assists students in growing their artistic capabilities, but also expands into every aspect of their life. As a psychology major, she learned how important it is to be empathetic of others' situations, so she recognizes that every student is different and strives to tailor each lesson to suit each

student's needs. she ensures that each lesson is a positive and enjoyable experience by maintaining open communication between the student, parent, and teacher, helping her students grow as musicians and people. When Ms Simeone is not playing or teaching violin, she enjoys running, writing, painting, and spending time with her wonderful family. Her Treble Clef Creations consists of a variety of hand-painted violins. The name stems from the treble clef hidden in each painting which began with painting damaged and poor quality violins to repurpose them with a second life.

Steve Ehrin is a freelance musician in the western Pennsylvania area. He is a member of the Butler County and Johnstown Symphony Orchestras and has played with many of the other regional symphony orchestras. In addition to his orchestral work, he is an active chamber musician as bassoonist with the Bel Suono Ensemble and WindFluence Woodwind Quintet. Complementing his performance work, he is a dedicated professional musical instrument repair technician specializing in woodwind and brass instruments. Mr. Ehrin is a graduate of the Mary Pappert School of Music at Duquesne University. From 2001 to 2003, he played bassoon in the Pittsburgh Youth Symphony Orchestra.

As of October 20, 2025, the ending balance is \$4,521.92. The remaining entertainment budget is \$1,600.00 leaving a spendable balance of \$2,911.92. For the October meeting, the Income was \$1,080 and the Expenses were \$918. Entertainment costs: September \$750; October \$150.

Donna Groom began singing at 18 months and learned to play the piano at 2 1/2 years old. She also learned to play the pipe organ and played regularly for service at 9 years old. An accomplishment was performing the Grieg Piano Concerto with a symphony orchestra at 15. She had formal training with concert pianists and organists;



attended Duquesne University on scholarship; graduated cum laude with a Bachelor of Music degree in organ and sacred music; and then became lead female vocalist with the famed vocal group *Jimmy Beaumont & The Skyliners*. As a professional studio musician and singer, Ms Groom has written and recorded many TV and radio jingles, has two CDs selling in Japan and was a featured guest artist on several others. She has acted as vocal contractor and/or background performer on several of the popular PBS "My Music" series, ranging from doo wop to country, and was also consulted and helped with post-production. She has held music director positions in several churches in the area; is on the faculty at Lincoln Park Performing Arts School as a vocal instructor; was awarded the Henry N. Mancini Achievement Award in 2003; is a member of the American Guild

The symphony, like most performing arts organizations, relies on fundraising to make up the majority of its roughly \$35 million annual budget.

This year marks the second year in a row the orchestra broke the \$1 million mark at its gala, which is its largest annual fundraiser. In 2023, the gala raised just under \$1 million, and in 2022, it was about \$900,000.
